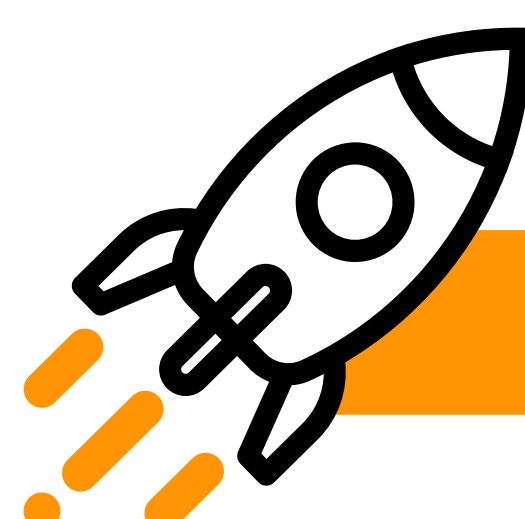
What is eLearning?

eLearning is learning that utilises electronic technologies to access educational curriculum outside of a traditional classroom. Our vision is to inspire, challenge and empower our learners, and eLearning provides an engaging platform to do this. Applying knowledge and skills flexibly and creatively, in different situations, empowers students to be successful in their rapidly changing world. Information and communication technology (ICT) has a major impact on the world in which young people live. The NZ Curriculum reflects this, with a strong focus on promoting digitally capable, global citizens.

Why it's IMPORTANT

At Te Ao Mārama, we are passionate about future focussed learning and what this means for our learners. Our children are entering a world that is looking for abilities that are far different from the traditional.

We want them to be able to collect and analyse information and then work collaboratively with others to apply that knowledge. Students need to learn how to learn, and to respond to the constantly changing technologies. With effective eLearning, learners become digitally fluent; knowing *when* to use technology, *how* to use different tools, how to critique the wealth of information out there. Most importantly, they learn how to use it responsibly.

eLearning fosters *curiosity* by providing learning opportunities and experiences and that go far beyond the classroom. It encourages *collaboration* with the ability to create or join communities of learners both within and outside the classroom. ICT use develops *creativity* with access to tools, resources and learning environments to learn, *create* and share. It also builds *confidence* in themselves as learners as they learn to use the skills, apply their knowledge, and grow their understanding of technology and digital environments. Learners become *community-minded* when making connections in authentic and meaningful ways, becoming part of a global community.
