RESTORATIVE PRACTICE?


A restorative school is one which takes a restorative approach to resolving conflict and preventing harm. Restorative approaches refer to a range of methods and strategies which can be used both to prevent relationship-damaging incidents from happening and to resolve them if they do happen.
