Who is my teacher?

Your child will have a Whānau Teacher, but all of the teachers in the space are their teachers, and will take them for various parts of the programme.

Self-managing - On arrival to school:

We encourage children to self-manage their belongings. This includes hanging up their bag on the hooks outside the classroom. Throughout the day we will encourage them to put their lunchbox and clothing away. It is helpful for them if they can open and close their own lunchbox and any packets. Wear footwear and clothing that they can self manage.

What do I need to bring to school each day?

- Lunch box packed with a healthy snack, morning tea and lunch (utensils if needed)

- A change of clothes/underwear for wet or messy play activities and bag to contain wet items
- My bookbag
- A named hat
- A coat or raincoat in line with weather conditions
- We are very well resourced so we ask that any **personal toys stay at home** to prevent loss or damage

What does break time look like?

At break time your child will go and play, then eat after. All food scraps or waste go home in their lunchbox. This helps keep our environment free of rubbish and is helpful for caregivers to see what they have eaten.

A friendly reminder that our school day starts at 8.40am and finishes at 2.30pm. If you arrive after 8.40am please sign in at the office. Whānau time is a really important part of our school day and it helps to have your child at school on time to be part of whānau time. This helps them settle into their learning for the day and be emotionally regulated. Your help with this is much appreciated.
