Helpful Information

Stationery

To make this easy for you, we have teamed up with OfficeMax MySchool to have our stationery requirements lists loaded on to myschool.co.nz.

Once on the OfficeMax site, select our school, click 'start' on view the Requirements List, select your child's class and follow the instructions on the website.

(Your child will be individually responsible for their own stationery, which will be kept in their tray. We will hold on to extra pieces and hand this out throughout the year.

Book Bags

Please ensure that your child is bringing their book bag to school every day. Literacy Workshops are happening each day, Monday to Thursday. Without a book bag, your child will not be able to take books home. We will store book bags at school until we begin to use these.

Sun Safety

In Terms 1 and 4, all children are encouraged to wear a hat outside. Please ensure your child has a named hat in their bag every day. A spare hat could also be kept at school in their personal tote tray. We have a supply of sunblock in Tūī Rua but encourage children to come to school with this already applied.

Home Learning

This year we have introduced a Tūī Rua Home Learning book. This is to communicate, between home and school, what your child is learning at school, and how you can support them at home (if you choose to or have time). This will include Reading, Spelling and Maths.

Term 1 Focuses

This term, our main overarching focus will be 'Here We Are'. We will be focusing on our school's story (how it came to be, our logo, school values, links with our local mana whenua - Ngāti Wairere, and the significance of the tui for us in Tūī Rua. We will also explore the significance of a class treaty (our school values) to support us with our learning. As a class, we will collaborate to create a korowai (cloak) to connect us together.

Our main Inquiry will be based around the story, 'Feathers in the Wind' which focuses on our words and the impact these can have on each other in either a positive and negative way. This story will be the building block to help us build positive relationships with one another, as well as ourselves as we recognise that having a positive self-image is a number one focus before we can build positive relationships with others.

This story will also lend itself to other curriculum areas such as Social Science and Technology. For Social Sciences, we will explore governments, treaties, how rules are made, and why they are 'needed'. We will also explore Early New Zealand times before laws were introduced, what it was like then, why they were introduced and the impact this had as well as how we treat people, the importance of kindness, etc. For Technology, we will explore the concepts of aerodynamics and design features for successful flight.

B.Y.O.D. (Bring Your Own Devices)

Tūī Rua is a B.Y.O.D. (bring your own device) learning community. The use of technology is vital in our ever evolving world and we want to prepare our students with the technical skills they will need. The use of devices will be an integral part of our learning community and daily programme. If you are able to supply your child with a personal device (laptop, chromebook, iPad), we would really appreciate it.

These devices will come to school and return home each day. We ask that **chargers are left at home** and that students charge their devices each night before bringing them to school.

Please **label** your child's device with their first and last name clearly. B.Y.O.D. is optional (but recommended). We will also look to provide some school devices to our learners.

A **User Agreement** will be coming home with your child in the next couple of weeks, so look out for that. We will also spend time in class creating clear expectations around safe use of devices and the internet. Can we also ask that if your child is bringing a device, that they start bringing these to school from **Week 3: Monday 12th February.**
