Book Bags:

Please remind your child to bring their book bag to school each day and put it straight into their literacy teachers basket. During our literacy workshops we use the books as another way to develop their confidence in reading through repetition of familiar sounds, words, and sentences. Along with Readers, you may also see a weekly idea glued into their Home Learning book.

A gentle reminder...

It is so important for your children to

start their day on time. Our school is open from 8:20 and the birds sing at 8:40 to signal the start of our day. To help set them up for an



unhurried beginning to their morning please ensure they are here, ready to take part in whānau time at 8:40 with their friends. This is a lovely way for them to connect and gain a sense of belonging within Pūkeko Rua. If your child is late to school, they will need to sign in at the office.

Lost property & Clothing Encourage your children to

check our lost property box as it quickly becomes overflowing! To set them up to succeed with looking after their things it would be super helpful if you could please name their clothing and remind them to put their belongings straight into their bag if they are removed. We will work alongside you to support them in this also. As outside can become wet and muddy during the cooler months, please continue to send along with your child a change of dry clothing.

We have 3 eating times each day; Healthy Snack, Morning Tea, Lunch. During Healthy Snack we encourage tamariki (children) to choose fruit, vegetable or cheese. Water is the best drink for drink bottles and strongly encouraged. On Fridays we have a school lunch order system available for use, the option choices change each week. You are able to order a lunch for your child through the 'kindo' app.
