Home Learning

This term, we are introducing a Tūī Rua Home Learning book. This is to communicate, between home and school, what your child is learning at school, and how you can support them at home (if you choose to or have time). This will include Reading, Spelling and Maths. More information will come out in a separate letter. As a school, we do not set formal homework so this is simply some ideas and suggestions that may or may not work with your family.

Math at Home - Multiplication and Division

This term, in the first four weeks, we will be focusing on multiplication and related division facts. By the end of Year 4, we hope that all children know and can quickly recall their x2, x5, x10 and some of their x 3. By the end of Year 5, we would also like children to know their x 3, x 4, x 6 and some other times tables. A great platform for learning these tables is the Hit the Button Programme as children can work on this independently and it's perfect for home learning.

Touch Typing

Another focus this term will be on the students learning to touch type. We will be using a free website called <u>https://www.typingclub.com/</u>. We encourage students to practise at home as well as at school.

Book Bags and Devices

Please ensure that your child is bringing their book bag and device (charged) to school every day. Literacy Workshops are happening each day, Monday to Thursday. Without a book bag, your child will not be able to take books home.

Term 2 Pākiki (Inquiry) Focuses

This term, our main overarching focus will be around a story called, 'The Pedlar of Swaffham'. The Pedlar of Swaffham is a popular legend told in England. It's a story that explores dreams coming true. For our Inquiry (Pākiki Provocations), we will focus on Science (Planet Earth and Beyond) as well as Social Sciences (Economic Activity).

<u>Science:</u> Some themes we will cover are our wider world, geographic locations and natural resources, countries, continents and Earth systems of heat and light.

<u>Social Science:</u> We will explore England, and schooling now and then. We will also look at the basic human necessities in life such as food, water, shelter, clothing and healthcare.

Hauora (Health) and P.E. (Physical Education) Focuses

Every fortnight we have an overarching theme that we focus on and then integrate into our learning as well as Physical Education programme. Last term, our focus themes were:

- Approaching and joining in
- Including others
- Being a good winner
- Being a good loser

This term, our focus areas will be:

- Using our WITS (walk away, ignore, talk it out, seek help) when upset by others
- Being positive to self and others
- Giving and receiving compliments
- Negotiating skills
- Suggesting and persuading others

Over a fortnight, we unpack what the skill is, why it's important and delve into the dos and don'ts of actioning a given skill. These skills will be shared on Google Classroom too so that you can also talk through and reinforce these skills for life.
